Idea

Evidence is spread thinly and experience is mainly local

- Relatively few severe burn patient numbers
- European Practice Guideline define a minimum level of Burn Care Provision
- A growing number of new and evolving treatment options
- Harness burn centers best expertise and experience with novel treatment approaches

Ambition

Promote excellence in severe burn care across geographic boundaries

- Share, ask and discuss: experiences, successes, failures, questions
- Identify opportunities for collaboration on topics such as
 - Collecting Real World Experience (RWE) on novel treatments, procedures, etc
 - Align and gather data on patient outcome measures
